



RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE CZECH REPUBLIC

of 23 March 2020 No. 281

on the adoption of an emergency measure

Following up on Government Resolution No. 194 of 12 March 2020, through which the Government, in accordance with Section 5 and Section 6 of Act No. 110/1998, on the security of the Czech Republic, declared a state of emergency in the meaning of Section 5(a) through (e) and Section 6 of Act No. 240/2000, on crisis management and on the amendment of certain laws (Crisis Act), as amended, due to the health risks related to the proven incidence of coronavirus (identified as SARS CoV-2) in the Czech Republic, the Government has decided to adopt crisis measures within the meaning of Section (5)(c) and Section 6(1)(b) of the Crisis Act in order to address the current emergency.

The Government

- I. **stipulates** that the exemption from Government Resolution No. 198 of 12 March 2020 and No. 203 of 12 March 2020 for cross-border workers on the borders with the Austrian Republic and the Federal Republic of Germany applies only to persons who travel out of the country for a period of more than 21 calendar days;
- II. **orders**, with effect from 12:00 a.m. of 26 March,
 1. all the persons specified in point I of this resolution, immediately after returning to the Czech Republic, to report this fact by telephone or other remote means to their registering health service providers in the field of general medicine or general paediatric medicine or, in the absence of a registering provider, to any provider in the field of general medicine or general paediatric medicine,
 2. all health services providers in the field of general medicine or general paediatric medicine to impose a quarantine of 14 days on the persons specified in point 1, pursuant to Section 2(7)(a) of Act No. 258/2000.
