



RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE CZECH REPUBLIC

No. 1373 of 23 December 2020

on extension of the state of emergency in connection with the SARS-CoV-2 epidemic

The Government

- I. pursuant to Art. 6(2) of Act No. 110/1998 Coll., on the Security of the Czech Republic, hereby extends the period of the state of emergency until 22 January 2021, this state of emergency having been announced by Government Resolution No. 957 of 30 September 2020, on the declaration of a state of emergency for the Czech Republic due to the health risks related to the proven incidence of the coronavirus (identified as SARS-CoV-2) in the Czech Republic, from 12:00 a.m. on 5 October 2020 for a period of 30 days, promulgated under No. 391/2020 Coll., which was extended until 20 November 2020 by Government Resolution No. 1108 of 30 October 2020, promulgated under No. 439/2020 Coll., which was further extended until 12 December 2020 by Government Resolution No. 1195 of 20 November 2020, promulgated under No. 471/2020 Coll., and further extended until 23 December 2020 by Government Resolution No. 1294 of 10 December 2020, promulgated under No. 521/2020 Coll., this being on the basis of the consent of the Chamber of Deputies of the Parliament of the Czech Republic given by means of its Resolution No. 1443 of 22 December 2020;
- II. **stipulates**, that all measures adopted because of the state of emergency, which are valid as at the date of adoption of this government resolution, shall remain valid in the scope in which they were adopted;
- III. **authorises** the Prime Minister to inform the Chamber of Deputies of the Parliament of the Czech Republic without delay.
