



RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE CZECH REPUBLIC

of 14 February 2021, No. 132

Adopting an Emergency Measure

In relation to Government Resolution No. 125 of 14 February 2021, whereby the Government, in line with Articles 5 and 6 of Constitutional Act No. 110/1998 Coll., on the Security of the Czech Republic, declared a state of emergency for the Czech Republic due to a threat to health in relation to the documented occurrence of a coronavirus (designated as SARS CoV-2) in the Czech Republic, and in line with Section 5(a) to (e) and Section 6 of Act No. 240/2000 Coll., on Crisis Management, and amending certain acts (the Crisis Act), as amended, to address the current emergency situation, the government has decided to adopt emergency measures pursuant to Section 5(1)(c) to (e) and Section 6(1)(b) of the Crisis Act.

The Government

orders, effective from 12:00 a.m. of 15 February 2021 until 11:59 p.m. of 28 February 2021, all social service providers providing social services pursuant to Sections 49 and 50 of Act No. 108/2006 Coll., on Social Services, as amended (retirement homes, homes with special regimes), to fulfil the following conditions in the case that the users leave the building or compound of the facility in which social services are provided, throughout the state of emergency:

1. leaving will be permitted under the condition that immediately after returning, the user will be placed in a separate area and within 72 hours from the end of leave, the first POC antigen test will be conducted, which will be repeated after another 3 to 4 days; placement in a separate area will be terminated if both test results are negative,
2. the user of social services uses a respirator of minimally class FFP2 or KN95 during the course of the leave.
