EXTRAORDINARY MEASURE

The Ministry of Health, as the competent administrative authority, pursuant to Section 80(1)(g) of Act No. 258/2000 Coll., on Public Health Protection and amendments to certain related acts, as amended, **orders** this Extraordinary Measure, proceeding pursuant to Section 69(1)(i) and (2) of Act No. 258/2000 Coll., in order to protect the population and prevent the occurrence and spread of the COVID-19 disease caused by the new SARS-CoV-2 coronavirus:

I.

Effective from 12:00 a.m. of 31 May 2021, the extraordinary measure of the Ministry of Health of 6 April 2021, Ref. No. 14592/2021-1/MIN/KAN, as amended by the extraordinary measure of the Ministry of Health of 22 May 2021, Ref. No. MZDR 21735/2021-1/MIN/KAN, is amended in that a new Art. XI is added after Art. X, which reads:

“XI.

1. A person that is an applicant for education at a post-secondary vocational school shall be enabled by the post-secondary vocational school to be present in person at the entrance examination, if it is not an entrance examination performed remotely, only if

a) they do not have symptoms of COVID-19, and

b) they submit a document issued by a healthcare service provider on a negative result of a POC antigen test for the presence of the SARS-CoV-2 virus antigen or an RT-PCR test for the presence of the SARS-CoV-2 virus, performed in the last 7 days before taking the entrance examination,

c) they submit a document issued by the school or school facility on a negative result of a preventive antigen test for the presence of the SARS-CoV-2 virus antigen or a preventive RT-PCR test to stipulate the presence of the SARS-CoV-2 virus, performed in the last 7 days before taking the entrance examination,

d) they have taken a preventive antigen test to determine the presence of the SARS-CoV-2 virus antigen or a RT-PCR test to determine the presence of the SARS-CoV-2 virus with a negative result in the past 7 days before the date of the acceptance examination and at latest on the date of the acceptance examination at the post-secondary vocational school,

e) they submit a document stating that they have undergone a laboratory-confirmed instance of COVID-19 and the period of isolation in accordance with the valid extraordinary measure of the Ministry of Health has ended, and no more than 180 days have passed from the first positive POC antigen test for the presence of the SARS-CoV-2 virus antigen or the RT-PCR test for the presence of a SARS-CoV-2 virus, or

f) they have been vaccinated against COVID-19 and demonstrate that

- i) at least 22 days but no more than 90 days have passed since the application of the first dose in the case of a two-dose scheme pursuant to summarised data about the vaccine (hereinafter the “SPC”), provided the second dose has not been applied,
- ii) at least 22 days but no more than 9 months have passed since the application of the first dose in the case of a two-dose scheme pursuant to SPC, provided the second dose has been applied, or
- iii) at least 14 days but no more than 9 months have passed since the application of the vaccine in the case of a one-dose scheme pursuant to SPC.

2. The school or school facility is not obliged to perform the test pursuant to par. 1(c) or (d) for the purpose of the acceptance examination.

3. In the case of acceptance examinations for post-secondary vocation school, Art. VII, VIII will apply as appropriate and in the case of a positive result of any test pursuant to Art. IX(1).”

II.

This extraordinary measure takes effect on the date of its issue.
